Our newest, youngest bunny; Harper had a lovely family come forward who needed a mate for their rabbit Hope, after her sister passed away.



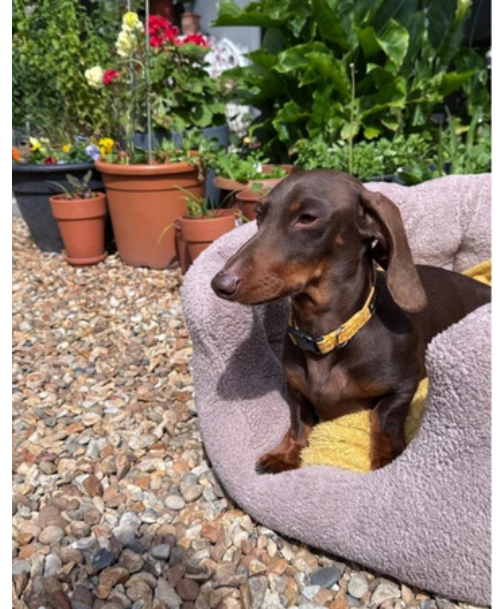

Young fox caught in fence

Over the past couple of weeks, we've come across several fox cubs who have found themselves in a bit of a pickle. The first cub managed to get his head stuck in a wire fence. Usually, a pair of snips or side cutters provides a fairly straightforward solution in situations like this, the challenge was actually getting to him.

He was trapped in a ditch overgrown with brambles, squeezed between a 12ft high school fence and a 6ft garden fence. Thankfully, the homeowner had a ladder, and we also carry ladders in our rescue vehicles. This enabled our Animal Rescue Officer, Billy, to carefully negotiate his way over both fences.

The cub was soon released unharmed and set free. He immediately dashed along the ditch, where he was greeted by another cub who had clearly been waiting nearby for him. The pair trotted off together without a care in the world... although we're not too sure their mum would have been impressed by their late arrival home!
